



# Summer Reading Program 2009

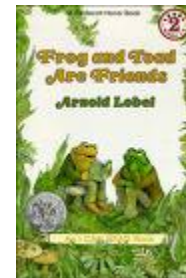

We are asking that students read one required book and complete a short assignment before returning to school in the fall. ## Assignment – Choose One:

- ⚙ Choose your favorite story from the book. Draw an illustration of your own to go with the story you chose and write about why the story is your favorite.
- ⚙ Write a list of ways in which Frog and Toad are similar and another list of ways in which Frog and Toad are different.
- ⚙ Make a poster for the book and write about why other kids should read the book.
- ⚙ Choose an animal from the book. Research that animal and collect five facts about where it lives, what it eats, and how it grows.
